INTRODUCTION

We are committed to respecting your privacy. This notice explains how we may use personal information collected before, during and after our relationship with you. This notice applies to you if you have registered to become or currently are a member, a competitor, a participant in coaching or you are requesting a service from us. This notice explains how we comply with the law on data protection, what your rights are for the purposes of data protection and who will be the controller of any of your personal information.

All references to 'we, our or us' in this privacy notice are to The HALIFAX, HUDDERSFIELD and DISTRICT UNION of GOLF CLUBS the postal address of which is: Halifax West End Golf Club, Paddock Lane, Halifax, HX2 0NT.

References to '**you**, the member, the customer or the player' refer to anyone who requests a service from us, enters a competition administered by us, takes part in coaching, player development or becomes a customer of ours for any reason.

We have appointed a Data Controller to oversee our compliance with data protection laws who has overall responsibility for data protection compliance in our organisation. Contact details are set out in the 'Contacting Us' section at the end of this notice.

PERSONAL INFORMATION WE MAY COLLECT FROM YOU

Depending on the type of service or membership you register for, you may initially provide us with or we may obtain from you **personal information**, such as, but not limited to:

- personal contact details that allows us to contact you directly such as name, title, email addresses and telephone numbers;
- date of birth;
- o gender;
- membership start and end date;
- records of your interactions with us such as telephone conversations, emails and other correspondence and your instructions to us;
- any credit/debit card and other payment details you provide so that we can receive payments from you and details of the financial transactions with you;
- use of and movements through our online portal, passwords, personal identification numbers, IP addresses, usernames and other IT system identifying information;
- o records of your attendance at any events hosted by us;
- o images in video and/or photographic form and voice recordings;
- your marketing preferences so that we know whether and how we should contact you;

- o identification documents such as passport and identity cards;
- o details of any golf club membership;
- o details of next of kin, family members, coaches and emergency contacts;
- records and assessment of any player rankings, grading or ratings, competition results, details regarding events/matches/games attended and performance (including that generated through player pathway programmes);
- any disciplinary and grievance information;

SPECIAL CATEGORIES OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

We may also collect, store and use the following '**special categories**' of more sensitive personal information

regarding you:

- information about your health, including medical conditions, health, sickness and medical records and health professional information; and
- information about criminal records for the purposes of safeguarding young people and vulnerable adults.

We may not collect all of the above types of special category personal information. In relation to the special category personal data that we do process we do so on the basis that:

- the processing is necessary for reasons of substantial public interest, on a lawful basis;
- o it is necessary for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims;
- it is necessary for the purposes of carrying out the obligations and providing appropriate advice to medical professionals in case of emergency;
- based on your explicit consent;

In the table below we refer to these as the 'special category reasons for the processing of your personal data.'

WHERE WE COLLECT YOUR INFORMATION

We typically collect personal information about our members when you: become a member, enter a competition, request a service from us, purchase any services or products we offer, make a query and/or complaint, or correspond with us by phone, e-mail or in some other way.

We may also collect personal information about you from any third party references you provide as part of your service request.

If you are providing us with details of referees, next of kin, beneficiaries, family members and emergency contacts they have a right to know and be aware of what personal information we hold about them, how we collect, use it and may share that information. Please share this privacy notice with those whom you feel are sufficiently mature to understand it. They have the same rights as set out in the '**Your rights in relation to personal information**' section below.

USES MADE OF THE INFORMATION

The table below describes the main purposes for which we process your personal information, the categories of your information involved and our lawful basis for being able to do this.

For some of your personal information you will have a legal, contractual, other requirement, or obligation for you to provide it to us. If you do not provide us with the requested personal information we may not; be able to admit you as a member, be able to properly perform our contract with you, or comply with legal obligations. For other personal information you may not be under an obligation to provide it to us but if you do not provide it then we may not be able to properly perform our contract with you.

Where you have given us your consent to use your personal information in a particular manner, you have the right to withdraw this consent at any time, which you may do by contacting us as described in the 'Contacting Us' section below.

Please note that the withdrawal of your consent will not affect any use of the data made before you withdrew your consent and we may still be entitled to hold and process that information to the extent that we are entitled to do so on a basis other than your consent. Withdrawing consent may also have the same effects as not providing the information in the first place, for example we may no longer be able to provide certain benefits or services to you.

EMAIL, POST and SMS MARKETING

From time to time, we may contact you by email, post or SMS with information about golf related services we believe you may be interested in.

We will only send marketing messages to you in accordance with the marketing preferences you set. You can let us know at any time that you do not wish to receive marketing messages by emailing us at <u>dpo@hhdugc.org.uk</u> You can also unsubscribe from our marketing by clicking on the unsubscribe link in the marketing messages we send to you.

DISCLOSURE OF YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

We share personal information with the following parties:

- Any party approved by you.
- Any governing or regional bodies for golf: to allow them to properly administer the sport on a local, regional and national level.
- Other golf related service providers: for example competition and handicap management software providers, email marketing specialists, payment processors and mailing services.
- The Government or our regulators: where we are required to do so by law or to assist with their investigations or initiatives.
- Police, law enforcement and security services: to assist with the investigation and prevention of crime and the protection of national security.

TRANSFERRING YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION INTERNATIONALLY

The personal information we collect may be transferred to and stored in countries outside of the UK and the European Union. Some of these jurisdictions require different levels of protection in respect of personal information and in certain instances the laws in those countries may be less protective than the jurisdiction you are resident in. We will take all reasonable steps to ensure that your personal information is only used in accordance with this privacy notice, applicable data protection laws, is respected and kept secure and where a third party processes your data on our behalf we will put in place appropriate safeguards as required under data protection laws.

HOW LONG DO WE KEEP PERSONAL INFORMATION?

The duration for which we retain your personal information will differ depending on the type of information and the reason why we collected it. However, in some cases personal information may be retained on a long-term basis: for example, personal information that we need to retain for legal purposes will normally be retained in accordance with usual commercial practice and regulatory requirements. Generally, where there is no legal requirement, we retain all physical and electronic records for a period of 6 years after your last contact with us or the end of your membership.

It is important to ensure that the personal information we hold about you is accurate and upto-date, and you should let us know if anything changes, for example if you change your phone number or email address. You may be able to update some of the personal information we hold about you through our website. Alternatively, you can contact us by using the details set out in the 'Contacting Us' section below.

YOUR RIGHTS IN RELATION TO PERSONAL INFORMATION

You have the following rights:

- the right to be informed about how your personal information is being used;
- the right to access the personal information we hold about you;
- the right to request the correction of inaccurate personal information we hold about you;
- the right to request the erasure of your personal information in certain limited circumstances;
- the right to restrict processing of your personal information where certain requirements are met;
- the right to object to the processing of your personal information;
- the right to request that we transfer elements of your data either to you or another service provider; and
- the right to object to certain automated decision-making processes using your personal information.

You should note that some of these rights, for example the right to require us to transfer your data to another service provider or the right to object to automated decision making, may not apply as they have specific requirements and exemptions which apply to them and they may not apply to personal information recorded and stored by us. For example, we do not use automated decision making in relation to your personal data. However, some have no conditions attached, so your right to withdraw consent or object to processing for direct marketing are absolute rights.

If you are unhappy with the way we are using your personal information you can complain to the UK Information Commissioner's Office or your local data protection regulator.
